


The Theater or "Auditorium" Style

Appropriate for short a short lecture or larger groups that do not require extensive note-taking.




Classroom Style

Most desirable for long lectures that involve note-taking.




Banquet Style or "Rounds"

Generally used for meals and small group discussions. 72" Rounds seat up to 10 people




Hollow Square Style


