- 1 SQUAW VALLEY I ALPINE MEADOWS
 A year-round mountain destination known for hosting the 1960
 Winter Olympics, offers an array of shopping, dining and activities including the new Tahoe Via Ferrata climbing experience!
- PENNY BEAR

 Penny Bear, also known as Ursa Mater, is one of several art installations you'll find as you drive the North Lake Tahoe's public art trail. Comprised of 205,000 pennies, this is definitely a family favorite! Located in Heritage Plaza, in the heart of Tahoe City.
- 3 HISTORIC STATELINE FIRE LOOKOUT Superb views of the Lake can be seen through the free telescopes. And a short, self-guided nature trail explains the history of the North Shore of Lake Tahoe.
- Roll the dice in this historic spot where California and Nevada meet. Three casinos, steeped in history of the Rat Pack days, are within walking distance. Make sure to check out the stunning crystals on display in the Crystal Bay Casino.
- Don't miss this side of the road stop-off! Offering vast views of Lake Tahoe and Diamond Peak, along with nearby hiking trails on Mt. Rose Summit.
- 6 MONKEY ROCK
 Stop monkeying around and go bananas over this Lake Tahoe
 Treasure (voted Best Panoramic View), which reveals a surprising
 formation at the summit.

- EAST SHORE TRAIL

This spectacular 3-mile paved path connects Incline Village with Sand Harbor and provides access to Hidden Beach, Memorial Point and other scenic vistas. It's a must experience by foot or bike!

- S P O O N E R L A K E

 From Spooner Lake, you can access several trails, picnic spots, and the popular Marlette Lake or Flume Trail. However, if you're looking for a quick outing, explore the Spooner Lake Loop. From here, if you want to drive the entire lake, keep going south!
- EMERALD BAY STATE PARK
 What better place to hike, tour a stone castle, Instagram from the picturesque Eagle Falls, or simply dive in? You can do it all at Emerald Bay State Park. A can't miss, it's the most iconic section of the lake.
- EAGLE ROCK

 Make your way north to this lookout point on your way back to Tahoe City which was once an active volcano! The vista offers 360-degree views that will not disappoint!
- GATEKEEPER'S MUSEUM &
 FANNY BRIDGE
 Explore the Marion Steinbach Indian Basket Collection, learn about the 1960 Winter Olympics, and become an expert in regional history. While you're there, feed the huge trout in the Truckee River from Fanny Bridge. Trout food can be purchased at the North Lake Tahoe Visitor Center right next door. And staff there can help you plan your next North Lake Tahoe adventure!
